

Big and Little



Materials Needed

- Paper
- Pencil, marker, or crayon
- Scissors
- Your hand
- A grown up's hand

Directions

Place your hand on the paper. Trace around your hand and fingers with your marker or pencil. If you need help, ask a grown up to help you. Cut out your hand tracing.

Have your grown up put their hand on the paper. Trace around their hand, and cut it out, too.

Look at the two cut outs. Which one is BIG? Which one is little? Ask your grown up to help write the words B-I-G on their cut out, and l-i-t-t-l-e on your cut out.

Walk around your home, and together find things that are BIG and little.

Talk About It

Why do you think your hand is little and your grown up's is BIG? What things did you find while looking around that are BIG? What did you find that is little? What kinds of things do you like to hold in your hand? What kinds of things do you like to DO with your hands?
